East Ohio CONAM Eligibility Requirements and Grant Guidelines

Eligibility Requirements

Applicants for grants must be at least one of the following:

- 1. A Native American
- 2. A representative of a 501 C Native American organization
- 3. A member of United Methodist Church with the intent to service members of a Native American community who have demonstrated a need for support. In this case, the application must bear the signature of the applicant, accompanied by that of the applicant's pastor. If the applicant is a pastor, the application must have the signature of the District Superintendent.

Grant Guidelines

- 1. Funding may be provided for programming related to outreach or seminarian support. No equipment, rental/mortgage, utilities, or salaries funded. Funds may support programs related to:
 - a. Education for Native Americans
 - b. Economic empowerment
 - c. Health care
 - d. Leadership and congregational development
 - e. Cultural revitalization, renewal, and reconnection
- 2. A projected budget must accompany the application and must disclose other sources of funding (e.g., ticket sales, ad sales, donations, other grants, raffles, etc.)
- 3. The application must be received 30 days prior to date of needed funds. Deadlines are firm, and incomplete applications will be returned without action. Returned applications may be resubmitted.
- 4. If funded, the CONAM Evaluation form must be completed and submitted within 60 days of funding or end of program (whichever comes first) and addressed to:
