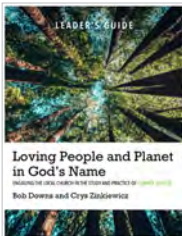
What's Inside?

More than a catalog, the *2024 Lay Servant Ministries Course Descriptions and Equipping Resources* is a resource itself. Check out pages 8-13 for an overview of the lay servant program and valuable information about the three LSM certifications for laity in The United Methodist Church (see this same overview in Spanish, pages 60-66).

The resources are designed to equip laity for their roles in ministry as disciples of Jesus Christ. The "Introduction to Lay Ministry: The BASIC Course" is the foundational course for Lay Servant Ministries. This course can also be used as part of a discipleship plan for other laity in the church to acquaint them with their gifts, calling, and responsibilities as followers of Christ. Consider using the BASIC course as part of your Christian education program. It can easily be divided into five 2-hour, six 90 minute, or ten 1-hour sessions. Or consider hosting a lay academy in your local church, offering both the BASIC and an advanced course.

With the exception of online courses taken through BeADisciple.com, all courses are designed as 10-hour trainings. Courses include a required text for participants and leaders, as well as a leader's guide for the facilitator of the course. Most primary texts and PDF Leader Guides are available through UpperRoom.org/store unless otherwise noted.

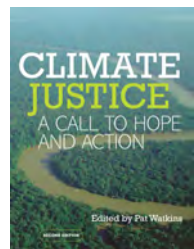

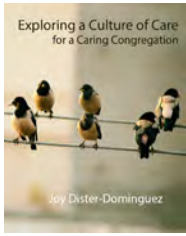

Watkins, this course helps local churches grow deeper in their faith through the caring creation of practical and context-specific plans that mitigate the effects of reckless human consumption.

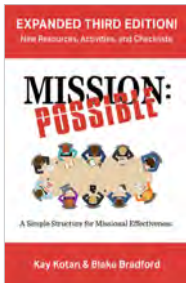
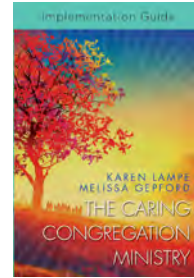

Exploring a Culture of Care for a Caring Congregation is the latest advanced course to feature the work of Karen Lampe's team at ***The Caring Congregation***. Care is the heart of the church; it's what Jesus modeled in his time here on earth, and it's what we are called to do as the church. While most people consider themselves caring, examining, and understanding the basic elements of care allow us to be intentional in how we care, modeled after the actions of Jesus. It's not about creating

a "care club" for our members, but rather conscious actions and reactions that allow us to care for one another, deepening our discipleship as we make disciples of Jesus Christ for the world to be transformed. This new advanced course is based on *The Caring Congregation: Implementation Guide* by Karen Lampe with a Leader's Guide by Joy Dister-Dominguez. It offers participants tools for deep listening and grows their capacity to care in difficult situations of loss – all within healthy boundaries and a thoughtful awareness of the varying cultural contexts of caring ministry. Mission Possible 3: Lay Servants Leading and Governing Congregations with Simplified Accountable Structure - In ¶ 266 of the 2016 *Book of Discipline*, lay and clergy leaders have a powerful flexibility to consolidate the governance functions of the church into a single board that holds the pastor and other teams accountable to the church's mission. In this structure laity are set free to lead with full accountability to Jesus' Great Commission and the Charge Conference of the congregation. Kay Kotan and Blake Bradford, co-authors of *Impact: Reclaiming the Call of Lay*

Ministry, have adapted the rich insights of their latest book, *Mission Possible 3: A Simple Structure for Missional Effectiveness*, into a new 10-hour advanced course that emphasizes lay leadership structured for maximum missional impact. Available **Summer 2024**. See page 49.

In ***Fresh Expressions of Faith***, conference LSM directors Kim Arnott and Linda Flanagan invite participants to discover the power of “third places” and the ministry of presence. Sharing insights from the Kenneth L. Carter and Audrey Warren’s book, *Fresh Expressions: A New Kind of Methodist Church for People Not in Church*, These reliable guides help participants rekindle their hearts to engage people beyond church walls with the love and welcome of Jesus Christ. They remind us that “Fresh Expressions” are new communities or extensions of current ones that become

new forms of life in Jesus Christ through prayer and the movement of the Holy Spirit. Beginning where discipleship always starts (relationships), participants will grasp how genuine, authentic gatherings meet people where they are and can become means of grace for both those disconnected from church and those who long to see others made whole by grace. Whom shall I send? A Comprehensive Field Guide on Certified Lay Ministry in the UMC. This new resource by CLM architect and module author, Julia Kuhn Sharp, is an all-in-one practical Field Guide for church leaders interested in all things CLM. Drawing from the work of on vocational imagination and place by Randy Litchfield and others, this field guide focuses on connecting call and context. It also explains the rationale for and specific steps into Certified Lay Ministry, including practical material for Judicatory, Conference, District, and local church leaders to support the certification and placement of Lay Ministers. This book is also relevant for Ministry Mentors and Seminary and Course of Study faculty nurturing the next generation of pastoral leaders working in underserved,

isolated, transitional, or growing communities. It cultivates a culture of call that meets the ministry challenges of a post-covid/post-separation world. This resource lays the groundwork for understanding, recognizing, and utilizing CLMs in the evolving contexts of faithful life in Jesus in the 21st century. Available **January 2025**.

In ***The Millennial Narrative: Sharing a Good Life with the Next Generation***, Dr. Jaco J. Hamman invites those who would care for and bear witness to the lives of young people to actually listen to their stories of struggle, love, and loss – all through the lens of an unlikely story from scripture. The lived experience of many young people and the Book of Joel overlap in significant ways: remembering loss and trauma; desiring community; believing in a gracious God; experiencing spiritual renewal; appreciating accountability; and a longing to help and be a blessing to others. These are the realities that The Book of Joel speaks to powerfully in a world that has come of age. Participants in this new LSM course will: rediscover the book of Joel as a script that resonates with the lives of young people; learn to tell a life-giving story; lead differently in partnership with young people; join with young people who are already making a difference in the world; and help their churches focus on the ‘why’ of Jesus’ love by sharing abundant life with the next generation of witnesses. The Talking Bible: Exploring the Old Testament as Dialogue and Conversation

This study is based on the book by Dr. William P. Brown. It explores the sacred reality of the Bible in wide-ranging dialogue with itself and with readers of diverse perspectives and life-experiences. The Bible is indeed the quintessential “talking book” because it has its own habit of talking to itself, setting a precedent that allows readers to even “talk back” to the Bible. Learners will discover that the diverse and even contending voices in the Bible, despite and even because of their tensions and disagreements, can be regarded as Scripture’s strength, rather than its weakness.

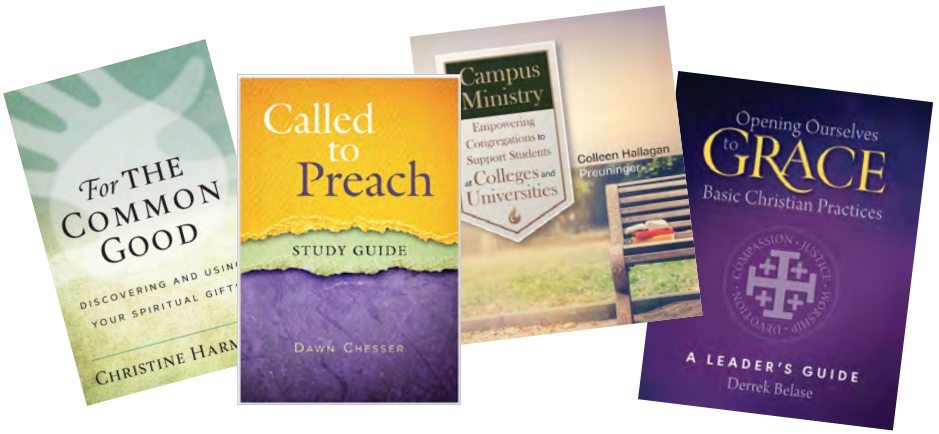

Lay Servant Ministries

Course Descriptions and Equipping Resources

Laity Sunday*

Laity Sunday is a special Sunday defined by General Conference “to celebrate the ministry of all Christians” (2016 *Book of Discipline*, ¶ 264.2. Traditionally observed on the third Sunday in October, Laity Sunday is one way we express the deep conviction that all are called to participate in God’s mission and live this calling through the ministry of the church. Ministries of the laity include: lay leaders, lay servants, lay speakers, lay ministers, lay missionaries, deaconesses, home missionaries, United Methodist Women, United Methodist Men, The Walk to Emmaus, Chrysalis, missionary service, and so many other significant forms of ministry.

The **Laity Sunday themes** for this quadrennium come from 2 Timothy 1:1-14. In this passage we hear a call to **Rise Up** and *revive* God’s gift that first lived in those who have loved and passed it on to us. We hear a call to Rise Up and recognize and *reveal* the grace in Christ that destroys death and brings life. As we Rise Up and *remain* committed to Love’s teaching, we also Rise Up and *retain* the good thing placed in our trust by the Holy Spirit.

The 2023 theme is **Rise Up! And Retain the Spirit’s Good and Beautiful Things** (2 Timothy 1:13). To find resources for Laity Sunday, visit the Discipleship Ministries website at UMCDiscipleship.org/equipping-leaders/lay-ministry and search Laity Sunday.

Lay Servant Ministries


Lay Servant Ministries is one of the most significant lay leadership development programs available within the United Methodist connection. Through this equipping and empowering system, lay servants have the opportunity to grow as disciples of Jesus Christ who then go and make other disciples.

Lay Servant Ministries can be a significant component of any intentional discipleship system, particularly systems based on the core process or cycle of discipleship described in ¶122 of *The Book of Discipline*. Laity are the primary agents of holy love incarnate in the world: “The witness of the laity, their Christ-like examples of everyday living as well as the sharing of their own faith experiences of the gospel, is the primary evangelistic ministry through which all people will come to know Christ and The United Methodist Church will fulfill its mission” (2016 *Book of Discipline*, ¶127, “The Ministry of the Laity,” p. 97.

In this sense, lay discipleship is always leadership and leadership is always evangelism—because all who follow Jesus lead others to him. Laity are called to be disciples—and disciples lead others to Christ.

Discipleship begins with relationship. When we “see all the people” God calls us to love (#SeeAllThePeople, we discover that engaging relationships with others are more than marching orders for outreach and mission: they are the very source of our own spiritual growth and a means of grace. Discipleship systems driven by engagement create opportunities for spiritual growth and build new relationships outside our church walls. Through authentic and consistent experiences of God's grace, new disciples grow deeper in faith and are sent into the world to share Christ's love in mission and outreach. Disciples extend hospitality to those not yet in the body of Christ; they offer Christ by providing an opportunity for people to commit their lives to God through baptism by water and the Spirit and profession of faith; they nurture people in Christian living to help them find a true sense of purpose in life and what it means to live out their belief through acts of piety, acts of mercy, and other means of grace; and they put their faith into action by helping to transform the surrounding community through engagement in mission and ministry as they offer hospitality in the name of Jesus Christ. Lay Servant Ministries is about equipping and empowering people as disciples who lead others to a vibrant and world-transforming faith in Jesus Christ.

Certified Lay Servants

A certified lay servant is a professing member of a local church or charge or a baptized participant of a recognized United Methodist collegiate ministry or other United Methodist ministry setting who desires to serve the church and who knows and is committed to scripture and the doctrine, heritage, organization, and life of The United Methodist Church. This is a person who has received specific training to witness to the Christian faith through spoken communication, to lead within a church and community, and to provide caring ministry.

The certified lay servant serves the local church or charge (or beyond the local church or charge) through his or her witness, leadership, and service, inspiring others to a deeper commitment to Christ and more effective discipleship. Through continued study and training, the certified lay servant should prepare to undertake one or more of the following functions, giving primary attention to service within the local church or charge, United Methodist collegiate ministry, or other United Methodist ministry setting:

- Provide leadership, assistance, and support to the program emphases of the church or other United Methodist ministry.
- Lead meetings for prayer, training, study, and discussion when requested by the pastor, district superintendent, or committee on Lay Servant Ministries.
- Conduct, or assist in conducting, services of worship, preach the Word, or give addresses when requested by the pastor, district superintendent, or committee on Lay Servant Ministries.
- Work with appropriate committees and teams that provide congregational and community leadership or foster caring ministries.
- Assist in the distribution of the elements of Holy Communion upon request by a pastor.
- Teach the Scriptures, doctrine, organization, and ministries of The United Methodist Church.

To become a **Certified Lay Servant**, you must:

1. Obtain recommendation from the pastor and the church council or charge conference of the local church or other United Methodist ministry in which you hold membership.
2. Complete the "Introduction to Lay Ministries: The BASIC Course."
3. Complete an advanced Lay Servant Ministries course.
4. Apply to and have qualifications reviewed by the district committee on Lay Servant Ministries or equivalent structure (see ¶668.3).

To maintain status as a **Certified Lay Servant**, you must:

1. Submit an annual report and renewal application to the charge conference or church council and to the district committee on Lay Servant Ministries or equivalent structure, giving evidence of satisfactory performance as a certified lay servant.
2. Obtain recommendation for renewal from the pastor and the church council or charge conference of the local church or other United Methodist ministry in which you hold membership.
3. Complete a Lay Servant Ministries advanced course in the last three years.

Certified Lay Speakers

A certified lay speaker is a certified lay servant (or equivalent as defined by his or her central conference) whose call has been affirmed by the conference committee on Lay Servant Ministries or equivalent structure to serve the church in pulpit supply in accordance and compliance with ¶341.1.

The certified lay speaker serves by preaching the Word when requested by the pastor, district superintendent, or committee on Lay Servant Ministries, in accordance and compliance with ¶341.1.

To become a **Certified Lay Speaker**, you must:

1. Be certified as a lay servant (or equivalent as defined by your central conference).
2. Obtain recommendation from the pastor and the church council or charge conference of the local church in which you hold membership.
3. Complete a track of study including courses on leading worship, leading prayer, discovering spiritual gifts, preaching, United Methodist heritage and polity, and/or other courses as determined by the conference committee on Lay Servant Ministries or equivalent structure.
4. Interview with and obtain recommendation from the district committee on Lay Servant Ministries, or equivalent structure, to be submitted to the conference committee on Lay Servant Ministries, or equivalent structure, for approval and certification.

To maintain status as a **Certified Lay Speaker**, you must:

1. Submit an annual report and renewal application to the charge conference or church council and to the district committee on Lay Servant Ministries or equivalent structure, giving evidence of satisfactory performance as a certified lay speaker.
2. Obtain recommendation for continued recognition as a certified lay speaker from the pastor and the church council or charge conference of the local church or other United Methodist ministry in which you hold membership.
3. Complete a Lay Servant Ministries advanced course in the last three years.
4. In the last three years, have interviewed with and obtained recommendation for renewal as a certified lay speaker from the district committee on Lay Servant Ministries, or equivalent structure, and the approval of the conference committee on Lay Servant Ministries, or equivalent structure, for recertification.

To become certified as a lay speaker, you must complete a track of study that includes one course from each of the following subject categories:

1. The BASIC Course for Lay Servant Ministries
2. Leading Worship

 - Your Ministry of Leading Worship 101 (online)
3. Leading Prayer
 - Leading Public Prayer – Debra R. Tyree
 - Leading Public Prayer (online)
4. Discovering Spiritual Gifts
 - Discover Your Spiritual Gifts – William J. Carter OR For the Common Good – Christine Harman
 - Rediscovering Our Spiritual Gifts (online)
5. Preaching
 - Called to Preach – Dawn Chesser
 - From Your Heart to Theirs: Delivering an Effective Sermon – Tony Franks and David Carroll
6. United Methodist Heritage
 - Living Our United Methodist Beliefs – George Hovaness Donigian
 - Living Our United Methodist Beliefs (online)
7. United Methodist Polity
 - Life Together in the United Methodist Connection – Beth Galbreath
 - Life Together in the United Methodist Connection (online)
8. Other courses as may be determined by your annual conference committee on Lay Servant Ministries, or equivalent structure

Certified Lay Ministers

A certified lay minister is a certified lay servant or certified lay missionary (or equivalent as defined by his or her central conference) who is called and equipped to conduct public worship, care for the congregation, assist in program leadership, develop new and existing faith communities, preach the Word, lead small groups, or establish community outreach ministries as part of a ministry team with the supervision and support of a clergy person. A certified lay minister is assigned by a district superintendent in accordance with ¶419.2.

The certified lay minister serves to enhance the quality of ministry, much like a class leader did in early Methodism, through service in the local church, circuit, or cooperative parish, or by expanding team ministry in other churches and charges. As with lay ministry in early Methodism, the certified lay minister uses his or her spiritual gifts as evidence of God's grace. See also ¶268.

To become a **Certified Lay Minister**, you need to complete the following requirements:

1. Be certified as a lay servant or lay missionary (or equivalent as defined by your central conference).
2. Obtain written recommendation from the pastor and the church council or charge conference of the local church in which you hold membership.
3. Complete a track of study for certified lay ministers relevant to your assignment as defined by Discipleship Ministries or the National Plan for Hispanic/Latino Ministry in collaboration with Discipleship Ministries and the conference committee on Lay Servant Ministries or equivalent structure.
4. Receive a letter of recommendation from your district superintendent.
5. Have all requirements for certification, including appropriate screening and assessment, as defined by the annual conference, reviewed by the conference committee on Lay Servant Ministries, or equivalent structure, for referral to the district committee on ordained ministry for examination of persons who have applied in writing to be certified lay ministers and to make recommendation for certification (see ¶666.10). After the district committee on ordained ministry interviews you, the district committee on ordained ministry will make a recommendation to the conference committee on Lay Servant Ministries for final certification by that committee.

To maintain status as a **Certified Lay Minister**, you must:

1. Submit an annual report to the charge conference or church council where membership is held and to the conference committee on Lay Servant Ministries or equivalent structure, giving evidence of satisfactory performance as a certified lay minister.

2. Every two years, obtain a ministry review by the committee on pastor-parish relations, church council, or charge conference from the congregation of which you are a member, or when under assignment, from the committee on pastor-parish relations, charge conference, or supervisory board of the ministry setting in which you are assigned.
3. Complete a Lay Servant Ministries advanced course or approved continuing education event, as defined by the conference committee on Lay Servant Ministries or equivalent structure in the last two years.
4. Obtain recommendation for recertification from the district superintendent.
5. Have all requirements for recertification reviewed by the conference committee on Lay Servant Ministries or equivalent structure for referral to the district committee on ordained ministry (for examination every two years when you have applied in writing to be renewed as a certified lay minister and obtain recommendation for recertification; see ¶1666.10). After the district committee on ordained ministry interviews you, the district committee on ordained ministry will make a recommendation to the conference committee on Lay Servant Ministries for final recertification by that committee.

Certified Lay Ministers with Specializations

To become a certified lay minister (CLM) with a specialization in a particular area, the CLM would need to complete additional educational/training requirements specific to that area of ministry. Each specialization has its own accreditation body. Specific requirements for **UM Parish Nurse, NPHLM Lay Missioner, UMC Path 1 Lay Church Planter, Children's Faith Formation, Men's Ministry Specialist, Congregational Care Minister, Simple Accountable Structure Coach, and Certified UM Church Administrator**, and the **Methodist Story** can be found at [UMCDiscipleship.org/resources/certified-lay-minister](https://umcdiscipleship.org/resources/certified-lay-minister).

Lay Servant Ministries Course Offerings

CERTIFIED LAY MINISTRY TRAINING

Specialization as a UM Parish Nurse

Foundations of Faith Community Nursing Curriculum

CLMs will need to complete The Caring Congregation's newly revised full Congregational Care Ministry Seminar in addition to their CLM training. Specialization as a Certified UM Church Administrator (CUMCA)

GCFA and the Academy of Church Business Administration

This specialization is granted through a partnership between the General Council on Finance and Administration (GCFA) and the office of laity and spiritual leadership at Discipleship Ministries. The course includes two weeks of training and a student project. Training is through The Church Network's Academy of Church Business Administration (ACBA) hosted by GCFA. CLMs completing this course and the required project through GCFA will be credentialed as Certified United Methodist Church Administrators (CUMCA) in addition to certification as Certified Church Administrators. Specialization as a Simple Accountable Structure Specialist (SAS Coach)

This specialization is granted through a partnership between the Office of Laity and Spiritual Leadership at Discipleship Ministries and the church consulting/coaching ministry of Kay Kotan and Rev. Blake Bradford. This training equips participants in understanding and leading churches to adopt the simplified, accountable structure (SAS) made permissible by the BOD ¶1247.2 as an alternative to traditional leadership structures (often described as simple/single board governance). This comprehensive equipping opportunity is based on the resources, experience, and training of Kay Kotan and Rev. Blake Bradford who have been working with local church leaders and congregations across the connection for more than a decade.

Specialization in The Methodist Story and the Ministry of Memory (MSMM)

How do we tell our story truthfully? How do we tell it effectively and faithfully as disciples of Jesus Christ? This specialization, granted through a partnership between the Office of Laity and Leadership at Discipleship Ministries and the General Commission on Archives and History (GCAH), is designed to help CLMs dive into the Wesleyan and Methodist tradition from a historical vantage point. Participants will begin with the basics of Methodism from its beginnings in 18th century Britain through its institutionalization in the United States and its reach across the globe. This is followed by revealing work to fill in the gaps of the 'dominant' narrative through histories and perspectives of ignored or excluded others. Participants then develop greater mastery of the practical aspects of remembering the Wesleyan story. At the conclusion, those enrolled will be able to articulate how Methodism in their local context connects with the grand historical trajectory of Methodism around the world.

The first learning experience focuses on **United Methodist History 101**, the second on **Expanding the Narrative: Gender & Ethnic Minority Methodist History**. The final and largest portion adapts GCAH module content from the **Local Church Historians' School** with a focus on the 'grand audit' (how to assess historical value), research (researching regional, communal contexts), and how to present history (the basics of exhibit, timeline, presentation, story-telling). 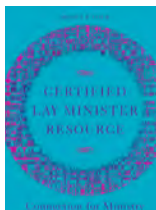

ALTERNATIVE ADVANCED COURSES

Exception Credit

Each annual conference has the authority to approve additional classes – called exception credit – for its own use. It is important to note that the design of the courses must fit the needs of that local conference and follow the ministry guidelines of Lay Servant Ministries. Courses must be recognized by the annual conference directors of Lay Servant Ministries (LSM) of which the lay servant is a member, and a certificate of completion awarded.

To help individual conferences assess requests for alternative advanced courses for lay servants, the following guidelines are provided.

Materials must fit these guidelines:

- The subject is in line with courses currently in the LSM catalog.
- The content fits the LSM theme of leading, caring, communicating.
- The course will benefit the lay servant for use in the local church.
- The course must provide at least 10 hours of study.
- The course is participatory and led by a facilitator qualified in the subject.

Participant's evaluation needs to address these points:

1. Is the text user-friendly (readable, understandable)?
2. Does the study help develop skills in this specific ministry?
3. Does the material equip laity in becoming stronger witnesses for Christ?
4. An evaluation of the class must be submitted to the district committee on LSM or equivalent.

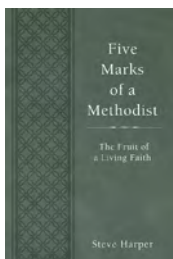


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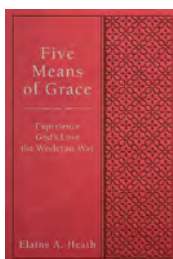

Ministerios de Servicio Laico

Domingo del Laicado

El Domingo del Laicado está definido por la Conferencia General como un domingo especial, en el cual «llama a la iglesia a celebrar el ministerio de todos los cristianos laicos, según sus vidas reciben el poder del Espíritu Santo para ministrar» (Disciplina de la Iglesia Metodista Unida, 2006, ¶ 264.2). Tradicionalmente, se observa el tercer domingo de octubre. El Domingo del Laicado es una manera de expresar una convicción profunda de que todas las personas son llamadas a participar en la misión de Dios, y a vivir ese llamado a través de los ministerios de la iglesia. Los ministerios del laicado incluyen a: líderes laicos, siervos laicos/siervas laicas, ministros laicos /ministras laicas, misioneros laicos/misioneras laicas, diaconisas, misioneros nacionales, Mujeres Metodistas Unidas, Hombres Metodistas Unidos, Caminata a Emaús, Crisálida, servicio misionero y muchas otras formas significativas de ministerios.

Los temas del Domingo del Laicado para el cuatrienio actual (2021-2024) provienen de 2a Timoteo 1:1-14. En este pasaje escuchamos un llamado a LEVANTARSE y revivir el don de Dios (que primero vivió en aquellos que amaron y nos lo transmitieron). También estamos llamados a LEVANTARNOS y revelar la gracia de Cristo, que destruye la muerte y da vida (2022). Al LEVANTARNOS y permanecer comprometidos con la sana enseñanza en fe y amor (2023). Y finalmente, hemos de LEVANTARNOS y retener las cosas buenas y bellas que nos han sido confiadas por el Espíritu Santo (2024).

Los Ministerios de Servicio Laico

Los Ministerios de Servicio Laico son unos de los programas más significativos para la formación laica disponibles dentro de la conexión metodista unida. A través de estos sistemas para la capacitación y el empoderamiento, los siervos laicos tienen la oportunidad de crecer como discípulos de Jesucristo, quienes van y hacen otros discípulos.

Los Ministerios de Servicio Laico pueden ser un componente importante de cualquier sistema intencional de discipulado, particularmente, aquellos sistemas con base en el proceso central o ciclo de discipulado descritos en el ¶122 de la Disciplina de la Iglesia Metodista Unida. El liderato laico es el agente primario del amor encarnado en el mundo: «El testimonio del laico, su ejemplo diario como cristiano y el compartimiento de su propia experiencia de fe en el Evangelio, es el ministerio evangelístico principal a través del cual toda persona vendrá al conocimiento de Cristo y la Iglesia Metodista Unida cumplirá su misión» (Disciplina de la Iglesia Metodista Unida, 2016, ¶127, «El ministerio del laico», p.99).

En este sentido, el discipulado del laicado siempre está relacionado con el liderazgo y, el liderazgo, a su vez, con la evangelización –ya que quienes siguen a Jesús guían a otras personas hacia él.

El discipulado comienza con las relaciones. Cuando «vemos a toda la gente» Dios nos llama a amarla (#SeeAllThePeople), y descubrimos que hacer relaciones con otras personas es mucho más que acatar la orden de marcha para el alcance y la misión: ellas son la fuente verdadera de nuestro crecimiento espiritual y unos medios de gracia. (Para acceder recursos relacionados con #SeeAllThePeople (Veamos a todas las personas), visite: SeeAllThePeople.org.)

Los sistemas de discipulado son impulsados por el compromiso de crear oportunidades para el crecimiento espiritual, y hacer nuevas relaciones fuera de las paredes de la iglesia. A través de experiencias auténticas y consecuentes con la gracia de Dios, los nuevos discípulos crecen más profundamente en su fe, y son enviados al mundo a compartir el amor de Cristo por medio de la misión y el alcance.

Los discípulos extienden la hospitalidad a quienes aún no son parte del cuerpo de Cristo al darles la oportunidad de dedicar sus vidas a Dios a través del bautismo por el agua y el Espíritu, y hacer profesión de fe; los nutren en el vivir cristiano, al ayudarles a encontrar un verdadero sentido de propósito en sus vidas y lo que significa vivir sus creencias a través de los actos de piedad, los actos de misericordia y otros medios de gracia; y ponen su fe en acción, al ayudar a transformar sus comunidades por el compromiso con la misión y el ministerio según les ofrecen hospitalidad en el nombre de Jesucristo. Los Ministerios de Servicio Laico tienen que ver con capacitar y empoderar a las personas como discípulas: quienes guían a otras personas a experimentar en Jesucristo una fe vibrante y transformadora del mundo.

Siervos laicos certificados

Un siervo laico certificado/una sierva laica certificada es un miembro de la iglesia local o del cargo, o un/una participante bautizado/a de un ministerio colegiado metodista unido reconocido u otro ambiente ministerial metodista unido, quien desea servir a la iglesia, que conoce y está comprometido con las Escrituras y la doctrina, herencia, organización

y vida de la Iglesia Metodista Unida, y que ha recibido una capacitación específica para testificar de la fe cristiana por medio de la comunicación oral, a liderar dentro de la iglesia y la comunidad, y proporcionar ministerios de cuidado.

Los siervos laicos certificados sirven a la iglesia local o del cargo (o fuera de la iglesia local o cargo) en cualquier manera en que su testimonio de liderazgo y servicio inspire a otros a un compromiso más profundo con Cristo y a un discipulado más efectivo. Por medio del estudio y la capacitación continuos, el siervo laico certificado/la sierva laica certificada deberá prepararse para desempeñar una o más de las siguientes funciones, y dará atención primordial al servicio dentro de la iglesia local o cargo, al ministerio colegiado metodista unido u otro ambiente ministerial metodista unido:

- Proporcionar liderazgo, ayuda y apoyo a los énfasis de programas de la iglesia, u otro ministerio metodista unido.
- Dirigir reuniones de oración, adiestramientos, estudios y diálogos cuando se lo pida el pastor o la pastora, el superintendente de distrito o el Comité de Ministerios de Servicio Laico.
- Dirigir o ayudar en la dirección de servicios de adoración, predicar la Palabra o dar pláticas cuando se lo pida el pastor o la pastora, el superintendente de distrito o el Comité de Ministerios de Servicio Laico.
- Trabajar junto con los comités y equipos apropiados que proporcionan liderazgo a la vida congregacional y comunitaria, o promover los ministerios de cuidado.
- Ayudar en la distribución de los elementos de la Santa Cena dondequiera que se celebre, cuando se lo pida el pastor o la pastora de la iglesia en la cual el siervo laico/la sierva laica tiene membresía.
- Enseñar sobre las Escrituras, doctrina, organización y ministerios de la Iglesia Metodista Unida.

Para llegar a ser un **siervo laico certificado/una sierva laica certificada, debes:**

1. Obtener recomendación de tu pastor o pastora y del concilio de la iglesia o de la conferencia de cargo de la iglesia local u otro ministerio metodista unido donde tienes tu membresía.
2. Completar el Curso básico de Ministerios de Servicio Laico.
3. Completar un curso avanzado de Ministerio de Servicio Laico.
4. Solicitar al Comité Distrital de Ministerios de Servicio Laico, o una estructura equivalente, que revise tus cualificaciones (véase el ¶668.3, sobre las responsabilidades del Comité Distrital de Ministerios de Servicio Laico).

Para mantener tu estatus como **siervo laico certificado/sierva laica certificada debes:**

1. Haber sometido un informe anual y una solicitud de renovación de tu certificación a la conferencia de cargo y al Comité Distrital de Ministerios de Servicio Laico, o una estructura equivalente, y haber provisto prueba de desempeño satisfactorio como siervo laico certificado/sierva laica certificada.
2. Haber obtenido recomendación para la renovación de tu certificación de parte de tu pastor o pastora y el concilio de la iglesia o conferencia de cargo de la iglesia local u otro ministerio metodista unido, en donde mantienes tu membresía.
3. Haber completado un curso avanzado de Ministerios de Servicio Laico durante los últimos tres años.

Oradores laicos certificados

Un orador laico certificado/una oradora laica certificada es una sierva laica certificada/siervo laico certificado (o su equivalente como lo defina tu conferencia anual), cuyo llamado ha sido afirmado por el Comité Conferencial de Ministerios de Servicio Laico, o una estructura equivalente, que sirva a la iglesia en la provisión de predicadores de acuerdo con lo dispuesto y para el cumplimiento del ¶ 341.1.

Un orador laico certificado/una oradora laica certificada sirve al predicar la Palabra cuando se lo solicite su pastor o pastora, superintendente de distrito, o el Comité de Ministerios de Servicio Laico, para el cumplimiento del ¶341.1.

Para llegar a ser **un orador laico/una oradora laica** debes:

1. Haber sido certificado como siervo laico/sierva laica (o su equivalente, conforme lo define tu conferencia anual).
2. Haber obtenido recomendación de tu pastor o pastora y del concilio de la Iglesia o la conferencia de cargo de tu iglesia local en donde mantienes tu membresía.
3. Haber completado una vía de estudios que incluya cursos en dirigir la adoración, descubrir los dones espirituales, predicación, política e historia metodista unida, y/u otros cursos que determine el Comité Conferencial de Ministerios de Servicio Laico o estructura equivalente.
4. Tener una entrevista con el Comité Distrital de Ministerios de Servicio Laico, o estructura equivalente, y obtener recomendación para ser sometida al Comité Conferencial de Ministerios de Servicio Laico, o estructura equivalente, para su aprobación y certificación.

Para mantener tu estatus como orador laico certificado/oradora laica certificada debes:

1. Haber sometido un informe anual y solicitud de renovación de tu certificación a la conferencia del cargo o concilio de la iglesia y al comité del distrito de Ministerios de Servicio Laico, o estructura equivalente, y proporcionar prueba de un desempeño satisfactorio como orador laico certificado/oradora laica certificada.
2. Haber obtenido una recomendación para continuar con el reconocimiento como orador laico certificado/oradora laica certificada de tu pastor o pastora y del concilio de la iglesia o la conferencia del cargo de la iglesia local u otro ministerio metodista unido del cual seas miembro.
3. Haber completado por lo menos una vez cada tres años un curso avanzado de Ministerios de Servicio Laico.
4. Haberte entrevistado, en los últimos tres años, con el Comité Distrital de Ministerios de Servicio Laico, o estructura equivalente, y haber obtenido recomendación para la renovación como orador laico certificado/oradora laica certificada, y la aprobación del Comité Conferencial de Ministerios de Servicio Laico, o estructura equivalente, para renovar tu certificación.

Ministros laicos certificados

Un ministro laico certificado/una ministra laica certificada es un siervo laico certificado/una sierva laica certificada, misionero laico certificado/misionera laica certificada, o su equivalente como lo defina su conferencia anual, y quien recibe el llamado y la capacitación para dirigir la adoración pública, cuidar de la congregación, ayudar en el liderazgo de programas, desarrollar nuevas y comunidades de fe ya establecidas, predicar la Palabra, dirigir grupos pequeños o establecer ministerios de alcance comunitarios como parte de un equipo ministerial con la supervisión y apoyo de un clérigo/una clériga.

Un ministro laico certificado/una ministra laica certificada recibe su asignación para ejercer su ministerio del superintendente del distrito, de acuerdo con el ¶419.2.

El ministro laico certificado/la ministra laica certificada sirve para realzar la localidad del ministerio de manera similar a como lo hicieron los líderes de clases en el metodismo primitivo a través de su servicio en la iglesia local, circuito o parroquia cooperativa, o al extender el equipo ministerial a otras iglesias o cargos. Como con los ministerios laicos en el metodismo primitivo, el ministro laico certificado/la ministra laica certificada usa sus dones espirituales como muestra de la gracia divina.

Para llegar a ser un **ministro laico certificado/una ministra laica certificada** debes completar los siguientes requisitos:

1. Haber sido certificado/certificada como un siervo laico/sierva laica, o su equivalente, como lo define tu conferencia anual;
2. Haber recibido la recomendación de tu pastor o pastora y el concilio de la iglesia o la

- conferencia del cargo de la iglesia local, en donde tienes tu membresía;
3. Haber completado cursos para ministros laicos certificados referentes a tu asignación, como lo determina la Junta General de Discipulado, o por el Plan Nacional para el Ministerio Hispano/Latino en colaboración con la Junta General de Discipulado, y el Comité Conferencial de Ministerios de Servicio Laico o estructura equivalente;
 4. Haber recibido una carta de recomendación de tu superintendente de distrito;
 5. Haber cumplido con todos los requisitos para la certificación, el asesoramiento y la evaluación apropiados, como los define la conferencia anual inclusive, y haber sido evaluado/a por el Comité Conferencial de Ministerios de Servicio Laico, o estructura equivalente, para ser referido/a al Comité de Distrital de Ministerio Ordenado, el cual examina a quienes han solicitado por escrito ser ministros laicos certificados, y luego hacer las recomendaciones para la certificación (§ 666.11). Después de que el Comité Distrital de Ministerio Ordenado entreviste al candidato/a la candidata, hará las recomendaciones al Comité Conferencial de Ministerios de Servicio Laico para la certificación final por el comité.

Para mantener tu estatus como **ministro laico certificado/ministra laica certificada** debes:

1. Haber sometido un informe anual a la conferencia del cargo o concilio de la iglesia en donde mantienes tu membresía y al Comité Conferencial de Ministerios de Servicio Laico, o estructura equivalente, proporcionando evidencia de tu desempeño satisfactorio;
2. Haber obtenido una evaluación de tu ministerio de parte del comité de relaciones pastor-parroquia, concilio de la iglesia o de la conferencia de cargo de la congregación en donde eres miembro, o cuando ejerces bajo una asignación, del comité de relaciones pastor-parroquia, conferencia de cargo o de la junta supervisoría del ámbito ministerial en el cual hayas sido asignado/a;
3. Haber completado un curso avanzado de Ministerios de Servicio Laico o evento de educación continua aprobado, como lo define el Comité Conferencial de Ministerios de Servicio Laico o estructura equivalente, en los dos últimos años;
4. Haber obtenido la recomendación para la recertificación por parte del superintendente de distrito,
5. Haber obtenido todos los requisitos para la recertificación evaluados por el Comité Conferencial de Ministerios de Servicio Laico, o estructura equivalente, para ser referido al Comité Distrital del Ministerio Ordenado para la examinación de personas que han solicitado por escrito la renovación como ministros laicos certificados, y para recomendar la recertificación (§ 666.11). Tras haber sido la persona entrevistada, el Comité Distrital del Ministerio Ordenado presentará tu recomendación al Comité

Conferencial para los Ministerios de Servicio Laico para la recertificación final por tu comité.

- Especialista de la historia metodista y el ministerio de la memoria [The Methodist Story and the Ministry of Memory Specialist (MSMM)]

Para llegar a ser un **ministro laico certificado/una ministra laica certificada** (CLM, por sus siglas en inglés) con una especialización en un área en particular, debes completar requisitos adicionales de educación/capacitación específicos para esa área de ministerio. Cada especialización tiene su propia junta acreditadora. Los requisitos específicos para: **enfermera/enfermero de una parroquia metodista unida, misionero laico/misionera laica del Plan Nacional para el Ministerio Hispano/Latino, plantador laico/plantadora laica de iglesias de Path1 de la Iglesia Metodista Unida, la formación de fe para niños, especialista en el ministerio de los hombres, ministro o ministra del cuidado congregacional, administrador certificado/administradora certificada de la iglesia de la Iglesia Metodista Unida, y especialista de una estructura simple y responsable de liderazgo** se pueden encontrar en UMCDiscipleship.org/resources/certified-lay-minister.
